

SECOND WATERCRAFT POLICY

In the event you own a second watercraft (dinghy, canoe, wave runner, runabout, fishing boat, etc.), the following rules apply:

- Your second watercraft must be affixed to your primary watercraft by means of davits or other similar mechanism.
- Watercrafts belonging to more than one member/renter in a slip is not permitted.
- Your primary and second watercraft together cannot protrude more than 3 feet beyond the end of your dock finger. This ruling is set forth by governing authorities so as not to create a navigational hazard.
- Watercraft(s) housed in the slip must be licensed / titled to only you or your designated renter.
- Under no circumstances are you permitted to use common dock space (not considered a slip) to tie up for extended periods of time (more than 24 hours). A second watercraft tied up after 24 hours on common dock space is at risk of being pulled.
- Courtesy parking along the north side of F dock is permitted to allow easy access to the clubhouse and pool area. However, there is a 4 hour maximum time limit and this tie-along is not available to members' guests or dry stackers.

NOTE: ONLY MEMBERS AND RENTERS HAVING A SECOND WATERCRAFT FALLING UNDER THE GUIDELINES ABOVE AND DRY STACKER BOATS ARE PERMITTED TO USE THE TIE-ALONG SPACE. ANY MEMBER OR RENTER HAVING A SECOND WATERCRAFT THAT DOES NOT QUALIFY UNDER THESE RESTRICTIONS IS NOT PERMITTED TO TIE UP ALONG THE DOCK SPACE

- You must maintain insurance and provide proof of insurance to MPYH.
- Upon receipt of proof of insurance for your second watercraft, you will be issued an additional sticker to be attached to the watercraft. The sticker will identify the watercraft as belonging to a MPYH member or renter.
